St Peter's Secondary School opened its primary phase in September 2014, with two reception classes. By 2020 it became an all-through academy with pupils aged from 4 to 19.

The St Peter's Experience

St Peter's is a safe, caring, academically ambitious school, where children flourish, developing their skills and God-given talents. Children advance their powers of reason and their creativity; they learn through discovery and grow to analyse, innovate, solve problems, collaborate and communicate well with others.

We work closely with parents and carers to ensure that the children have high expectations and we recognise and celebrate success at every level and in every field. We believe that as children develop confidence and resilience they love to learn and can learn to love.

Starting School

Starting school is an anxious time for both children and parents. We will make it as enjoyable and easy as possible. In the term before the children start, the parents and carers will be invited to a meeting where we will inform them of all they need to know about the school. There is also an opportunity to ask questions.

Prior to entry to the Reception class, the children will be invited to spend time in the school, in order for them to begin to familiarise themselves with the staff, the environment and meet new friends.

Teachers will visit the children and parents in their home. They will also liaise with all pre-school settings to ensure the transition to reception class is an effective, positive experience for children and their families

The Catholic Life of the School

Our School

St Peter's School operates under the joint trusteeship of the Catholic Diocese of Portsmouth and the De La Salle Order of Brothers. St Peter's has existed since 1936 and is a De La Salle School; although there are no brothers on site now there is still a very strong tradition of the Lasallian Spirit.

We have 60 places available for Reception age children starting in September. Each Reception class teacher is supported by a teaching assistant. Our staff's dynamism and vision create a curriculum and style of teaching that ensures rapid progress and engagement from the start. We are a school that works closely with families and believe educating young children is a joint enterprise between the school, the home and the church community.

All of our classrooms for the current year groups have recently been refurbished. Each has its own cloakroom and toilets. There is an extensive outdoor space which allows learning to take place inside and outside the classroom. There is a vast field and hard play area with an Adventure Trim Trail. The primary children also benefit from the specialist facilities available, such as the large hall and gym.

The Benefits of an All-Through School

We are proud to be an all-through school and delighted with the enormous advantages that it offers our pupils and their families.

- St Peter's has a shared educational ethos across its Primary and Secondary Phases.
 Our teaching philosophy supports children from 4 to 19 and ensures consistently high expectations for all.
- We know each child from the age of 4 so their unique and individual needs, interests and talents can be recognised, supported, developed and celebrated throughout their school journey.
- A wider breadth of activities and provisions can be offered for Gifted and Talented pupils and those with Special Educational Needs.
- Our Primary-aged children are able to access the Secondary Phase specialisms, resources and facilities more easily, as well as a variety of after school activities and clubs.
- Pastoral care and family support is consistent across the school so that relationships in our community can be strengthened.
- An all-through education also addresses the "dips in learning" usually associated with transitions and transfers from school to school.
