

Year 7 Catch Up Premium 2019-20

The Year 7 Catch-Up Premium gives schools additional funding to support Year 7 students who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). We also allow students to be supported into Year 8 to ensure they are not left behind in these two areas the best we can.
