ST PETER'S – JOINING US

We do not select our intake on the grounds of prior attainment or perceived ability. We believe that all students can thrive, learn together and sustain normal social relationships in a community that is inclusive. As a Catholic school we are more socially and ethnically diverse than average UK schools. We welcome every child into the School community whatever his or her ability, social background, or ethnic origin.

Students from St Peter's will advance to a wide range of degree courses. These include Medical and Veterinary School or the Russell Group universities – as well as Oxbridge or to specific vocational post-16 or post-18 courses. There are many dimensions

to school success be they artistic, dramatic, scholarly, practical or sporting. Opportunities abound in a rich mix of curriculum and qualifications.

Students with Special Educational Needs are provided with appropriate support. We have teaching assistants and teachers specialising in English as an Additional Language, Language and Communication needs and literacy and numeracy support.

Prospective parents/carers should be aware that the Southbourne site is built on a slope with multiple buildings and levels. The school does have a development plan for improving access but currently not all specialist areas are accessible.

ST PETER'S – OUTSTANDING SUPPORT

Settling in

We have strong relationships with all our partner primary schools and work closely with them to support the children's transition to secondary school. Our Head of Year 7, Sarah Johnson, Senior Leader for Transition and Induction, manages the process.

"As the leader for Year 7 and transition, I have the privilege of welcoming our new students into the St Peter's School community, helping them settle in as they begin this new phase of their educational journey and then see them mature and flourish as they continue through the school. This begins with visiting students in their primary schools and preparing them for the changes ahead through our Induction Evenings (information evenings for parents and students), and the Transfer Day when they get to spend a whole day exploring their new school. I work with a wonderful team of dedicated Year 7 tutors who are the first point of contact for students each day. They will monitor progress and help them through the challenges of adjusting to life in a new school. We endeavour to work together to make the transition process and settling into St Peter's as smooth as possible for both the young people and their parents alike while they adjust to the changes before them".

Keeping in touch

Parents and carers can access an Internet-based secure website at any time which enables them to view upto-date information about their child's progress and achievements as well as their timetable and the names of their teachers. We encourage parents and carers to contact the school if they have any queries or concerns via email, phone or by writing a note in the student's diary, which the students carry with them during the day.

In the first term of Year 7 parents are invited to meet with their child's tutor to review the settling-in period. Later there is a Parent-Teacher evening so parents can discuss the progress of their child with all his or her teachers. Parents also receive information about progress in the form of reviews at intervals throughout the year and a full personalised report is issued for all students once a year.

Providing support

The pastoral work of the school is a real strength. The focus is on supporting the students to achieve their very best by celebrating success, developing selfconfidence, fostering both academic resilience and mutual encouragement of peers and by allaying any anxieties and concerns. Students are placed in tutor groups, their care and welfare is the responsibility of Form Tutors. Each tutor group meets once a day during tutorial time, which includes a corporate act of worship. The Form Tutor is usually the first point of contact between home and school. The work of the form tutors is co-ordinated by Year Leaders and other pastoral staff.

St Peter's Chaplaincy is a ministry which serves to animate the spiritual and liturgical life of the School, support the pastoral system and promote the values of the Gospel. Its outreach extends to families, parishes, our two dioceses, local community and partner primary schools. Our own team is supported by local clergy and other religious groups.

Behaviour for learning

We focus on the positive behaviours that students need to enhance their learning. We recognise and celebrate their qualities of persistence, imagination, inquisitiveness, preparedness, collaboration and ambition. Relationships in the school are based on mutual respect. We value smartness, self-respect and safety for all. St Peter's is uncompromising, for example, about the importance of student appearance and adherence to the uniform code. We also operate a ban on mobile phones.

Our discipline systems are influenced by the Christian notion of forgiveness and reconciliation; however, school sanctions do exist to deter and correct undesirable behaviour. Sanctions include detentions after class, after school and on Saturdays or staff days; periods of 'seclusion' from peers and exclusions both fixed-term and permanent.

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Facilities

The School has two sites, each with excellent facilities and surrounded by ample playing fields. In addition to the provision of library/learning resource centre, science laboratories, workshops, art rooms and subject specialist rooms there is also a large sports hall with climbing wall, gym, 470 seat theatre, canteen, drama rooms, dance studio and a purpose-built Chapel.

Internal Examinations

School examinations are held towards the end of the school year, except for students in Year 11 who have mock exams in December.

Careers Education

Careers education and guidance are provided in a variety of ways through curriculum time, opportunities for interviews and specific careers advice and online support. The Careers programme begins in Year 7 where students are encouraged to consider real life decision-making and evaluate their own strengths and areas for improvement.

Extra-Curricular Activities

The School runs a number of clubs and societies. Out-of-school sports activities include rugby, soccer, hockey, netball, basketball, volleyball, cricket, athletics, tennis and chess. A Health Suite with cardio vascular and resistance equipment is available for the use of senior students. A purpose built Dance Studio provides for curricular and extra-curricular pursuits. A drama club, music groups and choirs provide live theatre and music at regular intervals. Students are able to attend sports, music, chess, computer and art and craft clubs during lunch hours. A number of educational visits abroad have traditionally been arranged including student exchanges, cultural visits, fieldwork, historical sites, activity centres and, for older students, working holidays supporting our partner school in South Africa and RTU in India.

Charging

The Governing Body believes that a state education is free. However it also recognises the valuable contribution that the wide range of additional activities, including clubs, trips and residential experiences can make towards the students' education. The Governing Body aims to promote and provide such activities, both as part of a broad and balanced curriculum for the students of the School and as additional optional activities. 
The Sixth Form

St Peter's has a large and flourishing Sixth Form with approximately 350 students. 
