1. INTRODUCTION

What a publication scheme is and why it has been developed

This scheme is for the St Peter's Catholic Academy Trust, covering St Peter's School and the Trusts responsibilities under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and the Governing Body is responsible for this scheme.

One of the aims of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (which is referred to as FOIA in the rest of this document) is that public authorities, including all maintained schools, should be clear and proactive about the information they will make public. To do this we must produce a publication scheme, setting out:

- The classes of information which we publish or intend to publish
- The manner in which the information will be published and
- Whether the information is available free of charge or on payment.

The Scheme covers information already published and information which is to be published in the future. All information in our publication scheme is either available for you on our website to download and print off or available in paper form. Some information which we hold may not be made public, for example personal information. This publication scheme conforms to the model scheme for schools approved by the Information Commissioner Office.

2. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The school aims to promote the personal spiritual, moral, intellectual, physical, social and cultural growth of each person entrusted to our care by:

- enabling every Young Person to fulfil their learning potential, with education that meets the needs of each Young Person
- helping every Young Person develop the skills, knowledge and personal qualities needed for life and work and
- this publication scheme is a means of showing how we are pursuing these aims.
